This edition of the Sharjah Architecture Triennial focuses on finding creative design solutions that emerge from different contexts in response to what is considered a condition of scarcity. The outcome is a series of works that are mindful of material usage, the energy required to outsource these materials, and their life cycles. Many of the conversations that emerged from the participants' work relate to materiality, directing us to reflect on how conditioned we are to use materials, such as plastic and concrete, promoted as a modern and more progressive choice due to their perceived impermanence. Dust is undesirable; it is disruptive. The presence of dust is often regarded negatively in both its material condition and metaphorically in relation to all that we consider a stain to the "purity" of society. Mourning in the Concrete Tent

Originally built in Dheisheh refugee camp in Bethlehem Palestine in 2015, the Concrete Tent in Al Madam Ghost Town is a space for collective mourning and solidarity with Palestine. While the tent is the basic element for the construction of refugee camps, it is also used for gatherings during funerals and protests. It is the material manifestation of the temporary status of refugees in the camps yet also symbolises their right to return to their homes.
